Arrival and initial briefing:

The group would be met at the top of the entrance to our site by one of our instructors. The group would then be led down to our main basecamp where we would meet your lead member of staff and collect the consent forms and sort out any absences or extras they may have. As for the initial briefing, this is where our instructor in charge of your trip would set the tone for the day outlining their expectations from the children, what behaviour will be acceptable and what behaviour is not going to be tolerated. The children will be shown where to go if they need to use the toilets, or to refill their water bottles. The group will then be split up and taken to their relevant activities.

Laser-Tag:

Laser-tag involves the children being split into 2 teams and then meeting the relevant objectives of the games proposed by their instructor. These objectives range from keeping control of the “radioactive slime box” to capturing the other team’s base. This activity helps with social interaction and development as well as communication and team work as the children will have to all work together and communicate effectively to win the game. At the end of their Laser-Tag session, the children will be given a scorecard and this will show them how many times they were hit by their enemy and by whom, as well as their accuracy percentage and how many times they fired successful shots at their enemy and whom they hit. At the end of the day, after all the groups have played the Laser-Tag, the winning team will be revealed and the top 3 scorers will receive a big certificate and a medal. All other participants will receive certificates of excellence for their effort and participation.

Lunch:

Lunch is not provided by us, so the children and staff on the trip would need to bring packed lunches with them. We have tables under cover that they can sit at and eat

their lunch. There will also be plenty of opportunities for the children and staff to refill their water bottles at this point

Bushcraft / Team development / Forest School:

This group of activities focuses more on what you as staff would like the children to gain from their session with us. For example, if they are in the transition year, they might not know any other classmates that they are going to be starting senior school with, or they are already classmates and you would like for them to improve their communication and teamwork with each other.

The bushcraft activity can come under the outdoor education category as the children will be educated on how to adapt to life in the woods. They will learn what kind of sticks and twigs and other materials they would need to make a fire, what leaves they need, what you shouldn't eat when in the woods. To top this off, they will all contribute to making a fire and will toast some marshmallows on the fire and turn them into smores as a small treat.

The team development is completely tailored to your requirements as mentioned above. Depending on what it is you would like the groups' focus to be on, the nature of our activities can be changed. We work with a focus on 3 words: resilience, determination and courage. We will talk to the children about these words and what they mean and how they can transport the things they will have learned about themselves during their time with us back into the classroom environment.

Forest school is again outdoor education where the children will learn about the wildlife that lives in the day to day world around them, their natural habitats and the food they like to eat. We will also teach the children about the trees and plants around them and the importance of looking after and respecting the environment.

Awards / debrief:

This is the end of the day where the overall team standings for the Laser-Tag will be revealed. Each of our staff will say a few words about the things that have happened throughout the day, again highlighting these 3 words: resilience, determination and

courage and how the children have done during their time with us. Each child will receive a certificate of excellence for their participation.
